Copyrights

By registering content, contestants declare that the content submitted (including images, graphics, slides etc.) is their original work. Neither the organiser nor the European Commission assumes any responsibility for disputes between persons claiming copyrights of content. By registering, each contestant declares that the content does not infringe any third party right. Contestants may not sample any music that is not in the public domain or for which they have not acquired the necessary rights to comply with the present rules of participation.

The European Commission reserves the right to exclude proposals submitted to the European level if it comes to our knowledge that there are copyright infringements or the content does not follow national legislation.

By registering content contestants declare that all identifiable individuals in the content consented to the use of their image and performance, the submission of the content in this contest, and the use of the content by the organiser and the European Commission for promotional purposes. Contestants declare that individuals in their content will sign all necessary documents granting the European Commission the rights to use the content in which they appear if required by the European Commission.

For promotional purposes, the winners on national level will have to make available a presentation of the content in a publicly available format, eg. a trailer, teaser, screen shot etc to the organisation and ultimately to the European Commission. By submitting their content, contestants declare their agreement that the organiser and the European Commission may use this presentation in its promotional activities. The organiser or the European Commission decides if and how it wants to claim and exercise these rights.
